Scope and context

Passionate about cultural heritage and want to share this with hundreds of young people across Europe and beyond? Would you like to gain even more relevant work experience in one of Europe's leading organisations for cultural heritage? Do you want insight into the issues and work surrounding cultural heritage, its policies and management on an international level?

The European Heritage Youth Internship Programme is aimed at raising and promoting the voice of students and young professionals in the field of cultural heritage in Europe and beyond. This programme is run by Europa Nostra & ESACH - the European Students' Association for Cultural Heritage - and can be carried out at the Europa Nostra office in The Hague or Brussels. The programme shall be complemented by participation in capacity-building events in order to equip the candidate with learning and networking opportunities for career development on the international level.

The intern will be responsible for:

- Developing new and supporting existing projects, such as the European Heritage Youth Ambassadors Programme;
- Assisting with recruiting, developing and nurturing relations with young members and developing related outreach projects (e.g. with the European Students' Network),
- Supporting the close cooperation between EN and ESACH (communication, membership, projects and programmes);
- Contributing to activities implemented in the frame of the European Year of Youth 2022;
- Other tasks such as online promotion or translations may be asked.

Requirements

- **Be a member of ESACH and/or Europa Nostra (you can join ESACH here and Europa Nostra here, both free of charge)**
- Self-motivated, creative individual with the capacity to propose and implement small projects, working independently as well as part of a team;
- Current Bachelors, Masters or PhD student in a relevant field (proof of University enrollment will be required);
- Excellent command of English language is a must; good command of French or other European languages will be an asset;
- Demonstrated passion for cultural heritage;
- Computer literacy (G Suite, Microsoft Word/Excel);
- Social media and graphic design skills, including basic web editing, will be an asset;
- Accuracy and flexibility.

Facts

- Monthly allowance of €300, some compensation for travel expenses and eligibility for ERASMUS+ funding;
- On-location internship in Europa Nostra's office in The Hague or Brussels;
- Duration 6 months;
- Starting date: October 2022.
